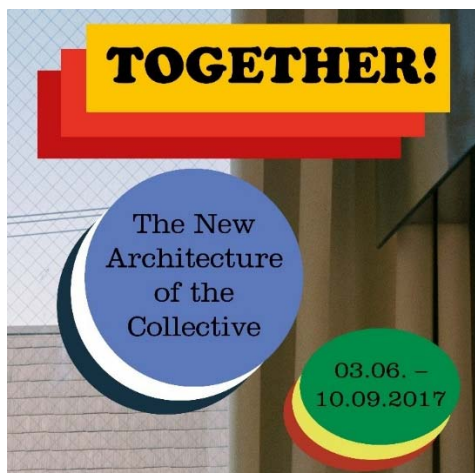

The scarcity and cost of housing is continually on the rise. As a response to this challenge, a silent revolution has begun in contemporary architecture in recent years: communal building and living. »Together!« will be the first comprehensive exhibition to examine this phenomenon internationally. The exhibition features examples by einszueins architektur, ifau + Jesko Fezer / Heide & von Beckerath, Michael Maltzan Architecture, ON design partners, pool Architekten, Enzmann Fischer und Partner, Ryue Nishizawa and others. At the same time, it elaborates the social and economic models communal living is based on and addresses its historical precursors, for instance utopian settlements of the 19th century, or the protest movements of the 1960s.
